



BIRDS

TEACHER LESSON

WARM-UP PLAY

Parents and children share picture books.

Parents follow their children's lead in play.

Staff mingles with parents asking, "What's new?"

GATHERING AND SETTLING

Parents and staff sing song while helping children to clean up.

All greet one another by shaking hands and singing the "Hello" song.

CLEAN-UP

*Clean up, clean up, everybody, everywhere.
Clean up, clean up, everybody do your share.*

**Praise your child.
Hug, kiss, smile, and say,
"Flying high!"**

HELLO

Tune: She'll Be Coming Round The Mountain!

*Oh, it's time to say hello to our friends. (Repeat)
Wave your hands and say hello. (Repeat)
Oh, it's time to say hello to our friends.*

WELCOME SONGS

Parents and staff sing each child's name during the song.

Parents face children toward them and hug and kiss while singing.

OH, HERE WE ARE TOGETHER

Tune: The More We Get Together

*Oh, here we are together, together, together.
Oh, here we are together at _____ School.
Here's ___ and ___ and ___ and ___ etc.
Oh, here we are together at _____ School.*

WE LOVE CHILDREN

Tune: Are You Sleeping?

*We love children.
We love children.
Yes we do. Yes we do.*

*Children are for hugging.
Children are for kissing.
We love you. Yes we do!*

PREVIEW AND CIRCLE TIME

Staff uses props and pictures to prepare children and parents for the playgroup activities.

DID YOU EVER SEE A BIRDIE?

Tune: Did You Ever See A Lassie?

*Did you ever see a birdie, a birdie, a birdie,
Did you ever see a birdie go up and go down?
Go up and go down, and go up and go down,
Did you ever see a birdie go up and go down?*

Help children use stick bird puppets to do the song's actions. Add verses, go side to side, and flying around.

TWO LITTLE BLACKBIRDS

Rhyme

*Two little blackbirds sitting on a hill,
One named Jack and one named Jill.
Fly away Jack. Fly away Jill.
Come back Jack. Come back Jill.*

Shake roller rattle filled with plastic "seeds" to rhyme.

FEATHERING THE NEST

Group Movement Activity

Children wave scarves as they fly around the room to the music.

Play lifescapes background music with singing birds.

CREATIVE PLAY STATIONS

Free play with theme puzzles, playdoh, stacking boxes with holes and bubbles
 ☯ Staff briefly describes the play stations that are set up throughout the room. Parents follow their children's lead as they explore the play stations.

FEEDING THE BIRDS Messy Play

Children and parents play together at a sensory table filled with birdseed. Provide berry baskets, funnels, large spoons and measuring cups.

PRETTY BIRDS Creative Play

Children glue craft feathers on construction paper birds. Label with children's names and send home.

LEAVING THE NEST Communication/Pretend Play

Children play in a plastic wading pool "nest" filled with shredded paper. Children take turns waving "bye" to mommy bird and flying out of the nest and coming back. Use the words, "in," "out," "hi," and "bye."

BIRDHOUSES Problem Solving Play

Children and parents play with shoe box birdhouses. Cut entrance holes in the boxes. Children fill houses with shredded paper and fit plastic eggs through the holes.

SNACK TIME

Children, parents, and staff wash hands. Serve snacks individually as the children are seated at the table.

 Cream cheese spread on a bagel, chow mein noodle "nest" and milk

TRANSITION AND FREE CHOICE PLAY

 Staff supports parents as children are prepared for transition. Parents depart for parent education group. Staff follows children's lead as they repeat activities at a creative play station, play with toys throughout the room, go for a walk or a buggy ride, or look at books. Children listen to a variety of types of music as they play.

REGATHERING ACTIVITIES

RING AROUND THE ROSIE

*Ring around the rosie, pockets full of posies,
Children, children, we all fall down.*

OPEN SHUT THEM

*Open, shut them, open, shut them, give a little clap, clap, clap.
Open, shut them, open, shut them, put them in your lap, lap, lap.*

SHARE A BOOK ABOUT BIRDS

Tell the story in simple words. Talk about the pictures and ask questions.

REVIEW

 Staff reviews the playgroup activities with the children and individually shares with parents what their children did during the parent education group.

HOME PLAY

 Set up a bird feeder with your child outside your window. Fill the birdfeeder together. Talk about the numbers, colors and sizes of birds that come to visit.

GOOD-BYE SONG
