CIRCLE TIME

DID YOU EVER SEE A BUNNY?

Tune: Did You Ever See A Lassie?

*Did you ever see a bunny, a bunny, a bunny?
Did you ever see a bunny, wiggle his nose?
He wiggles and wiggles and wiggles and wiggles.
Did you ever see a bunny, wiggle his nose?*

Pass out accordians to children. Add additional verses for flapping his ears, and hopping around. Beat drums to the song.

ROBBIE, THE RABBIT

Finger Play

*Robbie, the rabbit is fat, fat, fat.
His soft little paws go pat, pat, pat.
His soft little ears go flop, flop, flop.
And when Robbie runs, he goes hop, hop, hop.*

Pass out toys rabbits to children. Gesture to rhyme.

BUNNY HOP

Group Movement Activity

Children put on bunny ears and hop to and from parents gathering real vegetables placed around the room. Children gather carrots, celery, and potatoes.

Play Celtic background music.

CREATIVE PLAY STATIONS

Free play with theme puzzles, playdoh, soft rabbit blocks and bubbles

BUNNY'S HOME

Messy Play

Children and parents play together at a sensory table filled with green Easter grass. Provide toy bunnies and oatmeal containers with the tops and bottoms removed. Children put Easter grass and bunnies in and out of tube bunny homes.

BUNNY EARS

Creative Play

Children decorate paper plates with cut ears to wear. Children color ears with pink highlighter pens and glue cotton balls on the ears. Label with child's names and take home.

MY BUNNY'S DAY

Language/Pretend Play

Children and parents pretend to feed, water, and put stuffed bunnies to sleep in a large cage. Add plastic carrots, water bottles, and shredded paper props. Label body parts on the stuffed bunnies.


BUNNY MATCH

Problem Solving Play

Children put colored bean bag bunnies in matching colored baskets. Name the colors and use the words "same" and "different."


SNACK TIME

Free play with theme puzzles, playdoh, soft rabbit blocks and bubbles

 Canned pear half "bunny" with cherry "nose," marshmallow "tail" and juice

HOME PLAY

Praise your child. Hug, kiss, smile, and say, "You're wonderful!"

 Hide a bunny under your child's bed. Show your child how to use a yardstick to reach under the bed to get the bunny.
